#### The Library Corner

**BL2:** Helping Your Kids Make Good Decisions: Guiding your kids in a world full of options, encouraging parents of all ages and stages.

Teaching our children how to choose television, books and friends and who to listen to is a challenge for every parent. This book encourages parents by helping their kids through commitment, discipline, effort and behavior. Half of the book deals with how we make choices and the rest with the role of the parents. Three families at different stages of life are used as illustrations of what one can do as the children age. Scripture is used as a source of guidance as well as life experiences.

Children can learn to choose wisely or foolishly. They can blame others or be responsible. They can choose not to choose and let someone else do it. They will do what they have seen their parents, teachers, mentors and peers do. The parents' chapters are based on modeling, encouragement, guiding and choosing to allow good choices. The last chapter deals with sex, drugs and Jesus.

The Foreword is written by the authors 3 teenage sons. An introduction, appendix and notes of other sources are included in 185 pages. This is easy, interesting reading from which parents or anyone working with children or teens would benefit.
