# Library Corner... 2 reviews for the price of one! ©

#### The Best Of Bombeck: A Treasury Of Works By America's Favorite Humorist Erma Bombeck

Three of Erma Bombeck's books are included in this one volume: At Wits End, illustrated by Loretta Volmuth; Just Wait Till You Have Children of Your Own, illustrated by Bill Keane and I Lost Everything in Postnatal Depression, illustrated by Loretta Krupinski.

At Wits End takes you through the seasons making daily activities positive experiences by seeing the humor in them.

Just Wait Till You Have Children of Your Own is for parents of teenagers adding levity to the frustrations and anxieties that come with young adults seeking and learning independence.

I Lost Everything in Post-natal Depression is another collection of family life incidents that seem monumental at the time but put in humorous language become small and laughable. Husbands get more space in these stories.

Reading Bombeck before going to sleep can put the whole day in perspective leading to a good nights sleep.

More-With-Less World Community Cookbook: Recipes And Suggestions by Mennonites on how to eat better and consume less of the world's limited food resources by Doris Janzen Longacre.

This book will help those who still cook to combat concerns about additives, contamination and obesity. It also gives direction on what food combinations provide the best nutrition at the least expense. Food becomes a spiritual concern as well as physical in relation to sharing this with the rest of the world.

The book is divided into two sections: More-with-Less, the educational part of the book, deals with the results of what we eat and how cutting back helps our neighbors around the world. And Sharing the Recipes covers 251 pages with recipes in all categories from all parts of the world. Many of these from missionaries who learned to cook like their neighbors. Some interesting things are how to enrich your own flour and a basic master baking mix for bread, pancakes, biscuits, coffee cake and muffins. Browse through this book just to see how different it is from the majority of cookbooks.
