When it seems like everywhere you turn, you're hearing about the church's finances. But I do so unabashedly because Jesus Christ is my stewardship role model. Jesus never shied away from teachings that call us to share what we have with others. In fact Jesus speaks of the stewardship (managing) of our lives far more than Jesus speaks of prayer and even love!

Pray without ceasing, that's what we're told to do...So, let's do just that as together we commit our resources to all that God has in store for us; and then fasten your seat belt...God's Holy Energy, will be unleashed beyond our wildest dreams; taking us to new heights of ministry and service! 

#### Library Corner...

#### What Would You Do? by John Howard Yoder

(O154 110p. c1983)

The complete question is "what would you do if a violent person threatened to harm a loved one?" John Yoder offers his thoughts on this standard question from a Christian point of view. The author is a theologian who taught at Notre Dame and Mennonite Biblical Seminary. He received his Doctorate at the University of Basel and has written other books on peace and pacifism as well as other subjects.

The Preface explains how and why he wrote this book, which is divided into three sections. Each builds on the other and also gets easier to read.

Taking the Question Seriously is deep and theological. It deals with assumptions and emotions related to the question. War, options for action, and the way of Christ are also considered.

Other Ways to Respond includes essays on the topic by Leo Tolstoy, author; S.H.Booth-Clibbon, leader of the British Pentecostal movement; Henry Hodgkin, founder of the International Fellowship of Reconciliation; Joan Baez, folk singer and others.

Does it Really Matter? includes stories from real life situations that illustrate the experiences of people like Tom Skinner, a former gang leader in Harlem. Gladys Aylward, missionary to China tell how she stopped a prison riot and the results of her actions. Three other stories are included here.

The book seems dated because few of the writers are considered famous anymore. This does not take away from the presentation of the topic. The more one reads it, the better it gets. *Sally Shelly, Reviewer*
