Omphaloskepsis... It's Greek to Me!

A few years ago, knowing of my interest in words and building my vocabulary to feed my habit for *Scrabble* and crossword puzzles, a Covenant member introduced me to a website, www.wordsmith.org, to receive the Word of the Day each morning. One of the words that captured my attention has a Latin & Greek base. While you and I are more prone to use the English translation, I want to offer it to you in its original form: omphaloskepsis. Can you figure it out? A literal translation is "navel examination;" or as we say, "navelgazing"—presumably an activity that Adam & Eve could not do! omphaloskepsis.

Of course we know that navel-gazing has to do with introspection and contemplation and is used in reference to spending way too much time focusing on our own lives. A little bit of *omphaloskepsis* goes a long way! But as with most things in life, there are two ways of looking at it.

Introspection and contemplation are also important to our faith journey. And during this sacred season of Advent, I dare say that *omphaloskepsis* goes a long way as well—looking inward; mulling over; drawing strength; digging deep within; processing what we already know while allowing room for new insights. Focusing on "me and mine" is monumentally different from taking time to find meaning and purpose in preparing our hearts and minds for celebrating God breaking forth into the world through the birth of Jesus Christ.

This time of year presents us with all kinds of opportunities to celebrate and enjoy this wonderful Advent/Christmas season, here at Covenant and within the greater community. I invite you to exercise your spiritual *omphaloskepsis* by sharing in the many Covenant traditions of the season and as you think about at least one other person who would be blessed by being here too. Together may we journey to Bethlehem, seeking God's presence in our lives, longing to discover, "Emmanuel, God with us; revealed in us..." *Blessings, Joanne*
