#### Dear Covenant Members and Friends,

It was only one week ago that most of us were sitting amid the ripped wrapping paper, tissue paper, gift bags and bows, trying to sort through our gifts and remembering who gave us which gift. As I reflected on our Advent/Christmas season at Covenant, I thought about the Hope, Peace, Joy & Love we celebrated through the weeks. Then as I was preparing for last Sunday's message, I began to focus on the Light—how hope, peace, joy and love of God lead us toward the Light.

As I have declared through the years, my most favorite passage about Light comes from the Prologue of John's gospel (John 1:1-14): *"In the beginning was the Word and the Word was with God and the Word was God...What has come into being in him( The Word=Jesus) was life and the life was the light of all people. The light shines in the darkness and the darkness did not overcome it...and the Word became flesh and lived among us...full of grace and truth..."* 

In these spiritually crafted words of John we have the Creator God who first brought Light to the world where there had been deep darkness; and also the God who sustains us through the power of God's Spirit. We are meant to live in the Light; to play in the glow of the Light; to receive its energy. So why is it, do you suppose, that we humans are more intrigued with darkness than with the Light? Everywhere we turn it seems as if the dark side of life is threatening to extinguish the Light. Living lives out of love, and kindness, patience, generosity, truth, forgiveness, mercy and grace so easily give way to anger, hostilities; wars; lies, brokenness; selfishness; lust, power & greed—living fearful lives.

But John has a way of reminding us that the birth of the Christ Child changed all this. "I am the provider of the Light," says God. "And the darkness from this day forward, doesn't stand a chance!" The Light is for everyone; offered to any and all who are searching for God; all who are trying to find their way back home to God. And those of us who receive the Light are called to reflect the Light; to share the Light with others...to be a beacon, like a lighthouse lamp; like a street light on a dark road; like the light reflected from the sun's rays poking through the clouds or the glow of a full moon's light, lighting the dark night.

One Christmas Eve night, a young child, shivering on the streets of a big city, went inside a church to warm herself. She heard the minister say, "Jesus is the Light of the world..." After worship, she asked the minister if that were true. "Yes it is." "Then I wish he could come down to my alley," she said, "cause it's awfully dark down there..." We are called to reflect Christ's light; to bring hope and meaning to all in need. You and I are to bring the Light into the dark alleys of life... "The Light shines in the darkness; and the darkness HAS NOT, WILL NOT, EVER overcome it..." Let us gather for worship together to reflect the Light as we poke holes in the darkness of our broken, hurting world... *Blessings in this New Year, Joanne* 

### And Now a WORD from the Moderator ...

If you're like me, you have written or thought about more than your fair share of New Year Resolutions at the start of the New Year-eat better, exercise more, read more, deepen relationships with those you care about... the list goes on and on. I've missed on so many of the resolutions that I can't keep count. Yet, making good on resolutions isn't necessarily hard-it's like the advice we give to those who are going to college and who are looking for the "secret to success". For those college-bound students (including my own) the secret is clear, succinct, and only 6 words-Go to Class, Do the Homework.

So, wherever you are on your faith journey, whether you feel you are progressing well or struggling, my guess is that a similar tactic would work as well. The difficulty, for me, at least, is applying those six words, or a variation of them on a consistent basis. But maybe together we CAN: GO to worship; DO God's work. *Keep the faith, Chris Hitch*
