Maundy Thursday Service & Tennebrae (Service of the Shadows), Thursday, March 20, we will begin with a simple Agape Meal at 6:30p preparing us for worship (7:30p) as we allow the seasonal scriptures and candlelight to remind us of the wondrous love of Christ who gathers us together for a great feast of love...when we are together let us not be divided in mind. Let there be an end to bitterness and quarrels, an end to strife...where there is charity and loving friendship, there God ever dwells..." (Gertrud Mueller Nelson, To Dance with God, pg. 163)

Saturday Easter Vigil, March 22, begins with the lighting of the sacred fire at 6:30pm. A Bit of Easter Trivia

George Brigham of Shipley, West Yorkshire, England sends this interesting bit of useless inspiration as the question is asked, "Isn't Easter Early?"

- Easter Day is March 23 this year and is almost as early as it can be.
- The earliest possible date is March 22, as Easter is always on the first Sunday after the first full moon, on or after March 21.
- This means that there are 35 possible dates, but Easter has not fallen on the earliest date since 1818, and will not do so again until 2285.
- It will not fall on 23 March again until 2160.
- Easter last fell on the latest possible date, April 25, in 1943 and will next fall on that date in 2038.
- However, it will fall on April 24, just one day before the latest possible date, in 2011.
- Someone has worked out that the cycle of Easter dates repeats after exactly 5,700,000 years, with April 19 being the most common date, happening 220,400 times.

When I was new to the congregation, the church had a planning meeting where one group came up with a phrase that continues to resonate with me. That phrase, "We are a community of faith" summed up a lot of discussion. When we broke it down, it made sense to me-I hope it does for you as well:

We-it's not one of us, but all of us-each person who chooses to worship at CCC is a part of us-we are not exclusive;

Are-it's not a focus on the past or history, but a focus on the future;

A-not "the community" but one of many communities of believers, joined together in a common purpose; **Community**-sometimes we need the church, sometimes the church needs us. As a community, we need each other as we pull together;

Of Faith-we don't have certainty in many things unknowable and in the future, but we do have faith-in God; in each other, in ourselves and in our community...

As Joanne frequently says as we share communion, "All are welcome-come join the feast!"

Did you know that the Christian Church in North Carolina has two camp and conferences centers right here in our own state? Camp Caroline is located on the beautiful coastal waters of the Neuse River and Dawson's Creek in Arapahoe. And Christmount is nestled among the trees and mountains of Black Mountain.

If you've never been, well, you're in for a treat! Camp Caroline and Christmount offers camps for all ages starting from Kindergarten all the way to 12th grade. Camp scholarships are available through the church office. Camp schedules and forms are on the bulletin board outside of the office. Ask Rev. Perry for more information.

Adult Education Opportunities Abound!

Have you not known? Have you not heard? Covenant has wonderful education opportunities for all adults. Three different classes meet on Sunday Mornings at 10a...they are all informative and promote lots of lively discussion. Childcare is available for infants & toddlers; classes for pre-school-youth meet during this time:

THE DISCIPLES CLASS meets in the large classroom on the right (choir warm-up room) in the Education Wing. We are using The Present Word series; a Bible based study that helps learners apply scriptures to every day living and the world situation. The Present Word is a joint publication of the Disciples of Christ, UCC, Moravian, and Presbyterian (USA and Cumberland). The focus changes quarterly and goes through the entire Bible every 6 years. Everyone receives a study book that allows you to keep pace with the class even when you need to be absent. Bob Kennel is the primary teacher but members of the class also periodically share teaching responsibilities. We also have a special Hazel-baked cake once per month on an unknown Sunday.

SEEKERS CLASS meets in the last classroom on left (Youth Room) in the Education Wing. During February and March we will be studying THE WAY OF FORGIVENESS, an 8 week small group experience that explores Christ's call to live a forgiven and forgiving life. Jesus' teachings from the Sermon on the Mount (Matthew 5-7) provide the scriptural context for the study. All members, guests, and other "seekers" from the community at large are welcome. Come for the entire series, or join the group for one or more of the sessions.

HOT TOPICS meets in the 2nd classroom on the right in the Education Wing. Are you looking for a safe place to explore the current topics and events of this world? Wondering how your faith might address a certain issue? Looking for a group made up of a variety of ages and stages that is satisfied with not coming to any particular consensus about the issues of the day, yet leaving you wanting more? Then Hot Topics is for you. The class has explored weekly topics such as capital punishment; war and "just war," torture; global warming and most recently, immigration.

The class has begun reading & discussing *Middle Church: Reclaiming the Moral Values of the Faithful Majority from the Religious Right* by Bob Edgar. Edgar is a former congressman (D-PA) and former general secretary of the National Council of Churches USA. His book is written for Christians who identify not with the "right" or the "left" but with the "middle church". He challenges his readers to connect spiritual values to political issues and to be heard. Come join us...you'll be glad you did!

Wednesday Evening Adult Study continues...

Wednesday Evenings, 6:30-7:30p, the adult study group meets in the large classroom on the right in the Education Wing. Through Lent the study is based on the work of Steven Covey, The Seven Habits of Highly Effective Christians. The study has been adapted by our own Don Downs, who is leading the group in developing a personal or family mission statement and learning how to keep your life in check. Childcare is provided for infants-school age children. We hope you'll drop by and join us for this exciting study on Wednesdays 6:30-7:30 pm.

No End in Sight for Humanitarian Crisis in Darfur

Thursday, February 21, A.D. 2008

There continues to be no end in sight to the crisis in Darfur, Sudan, even with the arrival of a strengthened UN force. Recent attacks in West Darfur have displaced more than 25,000 people, worsening a humanitarian disaster that has already killed an estimated 250,000 people and uprooted more than 2.5 million more. More than 2/3rds of Darfur's 6 million people now depend upon outside humanitarian assistance for survival.

As of last Sunday, our Week of Compassion Offering stands at \$1412.72.

If you haven't had a chance to make your donation, make your check out to Covenant Christian Church and earmark it, "Week of Compassion."
