## Dr. Richard L. Hamm to Preach at Covenant Sunday, May 4 at 11am

Richard L. Hamm was born in Indiana and raised in Florida. He returned to Indiana to attend Butler University (B.A. Religion, 1970) and Christian Theological Seminary (Dr. of Ministry, 1974). He is an ordained minister of the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ), having served congregations in Indiana, Kansas & Missouri. Dick also served as Regional Minister in Tennessee (1990-1993) and as our General Minister and President of the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ) in the U.S. & Canada from 1993 to 2003.

He is the author of three books, 2020 Vision for the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ) and From Mainline to Front Line and Recreating The Church: Leadership For The Post-Modern Age. He lectures and teaches Disciples Polity at Christian Theological Seminary in Indianapolis.

He is now serving as Executive Administrator for Christian Churches Together, a new and very broad ecumenical organization that includes communions from five "families": Mainline Protestants, Historic Black Churches, Evangelicals/Pentecostals, Roman Catholic, and Orthodox as well as several Christian organizations including Sojourners, Bread For The World and Habitat for Humanity.

Dick and Mindy live in Indianapolis. They have two adult children, Laura, an ordained Disciples minister in Baltimore, MD; and David, who is a member here at Covenant. #### Library Corner...

The Gift of Pain: Why we hurt and what we can do about it by Phillip Yancey & Dr. Paul Brand (1914-2003), c1993, 1997.

This is the best of all the books about which I have reported. I expected it to relate pain and scripture in some way. It turned out to be a biography of Dr. Paul Brand, a hand surgeon who worked with lepers or victims of Hansen's disease (the respectable name for it). Thus, began an education about pain in relation to nationality, disease, absence and attitude; plus, the results of dedicated doctors who found ways to give life back to people who suffer.

Paul Brand lived in India with his missionary parents until he was 9 years old. There he witnessed the suffering of leprosy patients from rejections and deformity due to the lack of pain and rejection. He returned to England (his parent's homeland) for his education; then worked as a carpenter for two years. He began to train for the mission field but switched to orthopedic surgery during World War 11. Then he saw horribly injured people succeed in aiding others causing an interest in pain.

The end of the war allowed him to enter the mission field in India where he began correcting clubfeet without surgery. He used pain to show him how far a foot could be adjusted without doing damage. Next stop was a leprosarium in Vellore where they cured leprosy with sulfide drugs and proved most people are immune to it. Dr. Brand realized dead nerve endings caused the patients to abuse their bodies because the body had no warning system. Thus, noses disappeared, fingers got burned, feet became useless and hands turned into fists that would not open. Healed patients count not return to their home because people feared them.

Dr. Brand realized he had to find ways to correct these conditions developing tendon transfers in hands to open them up and become usable. He grafted skin for a new nose and developed special footpads in shoes to protect the bones. This led to a move to a leprosarium in Louisiana where he found much of what he had developed would help diabetes patients with foot problems due to nerve damage and AIDS patients who suffered from the stigmatism that the lepers suffered.

Paul Brand lived an incredible life, makes a tremendous Christian witness and explains "pain the loneliest sensation – no one can share it with you."

This was a pleasant educational experience.
