What Me, Worry?

Every so often it seems I manage to hit the proverbial nail on the head with one of the Sunday morning messages. And such seems to be the case for this past Sunday as I encouraged us to take a closer look at Matthew 6: 24-34; a passage filled with all kinds of reminders about how we should not worry. Easier said than done ! To put your mind at rest a bit, Jesus isn't telling us to never worry; he's well aware that we are going to worry. He simply reminds us that we are not to fill our lives with constant worry and stress. Of course we know we need to find effective ways to plan for our future. But when those plans take total control of our lives; when fulfilling those hopes and dreams becomes the driving force in our lives; that's when we lose our way along the path that is meant to bring us to a fuller relationship with God.

Are the concerns of earthquakes, cyclones and tornadoes or high tuition costs; or relationships on the rocks; or decisions about our children or aging parents or what we are going to do with the rest of our life made any easier because we worry so much? So, why is it that we always resort to worry as the order of the day? What will it take for us to *REALLY* learn to trust God; the One who's always there with us and provides us with whatever we need and then some? Perhaps this poem puts it all in perspective: "Alterations, No Charge"

Last night, I hung up my worries in the closet, hoping the wrinkles would smooth out by the next day; I put my fears into the laundry, so they would be clean enough to wear again this week; I made sure that pebble called stress was still in my shoe, where it has worn a hole into the heel.

But this morning, when I opened the closet, I found a whole new outfit, woven out of Easter lilies and resurrection's sweet grass and sandals made out of sparrow's feathers.

Turning, I found you standing there, a tape measure around your neck, chalk in your hand, saying with a smile, 'try them on . . .so we can see if any alterations are needed. (c) 2008 Thom M. Shuman


Covenant Church Family Picnic & Ice Cream Social At Bond Park in Cary Sunday afternoon, June 22 3:30pm-7:30pm

There are also miscellaneous things like adding mulch, keeping the weeds out of the plant area, a tiny bit of mowing, continued beautification of the garden, etc. This is a chance for you to volunteer with minimal commitment even if you are super busy.

It is so personally enriching to dig in the dirt and provide sustenance for the plants. One of the most exciting things about our garden is that as it grows and produces various food, it offers hope for people in our community through the Interfaith Food Shuttle who will stop by and collect the food to share with those who are hungry—go to: <u>http://www.foodshuttle.org</u> to see how this all works. And an additional bonus is that orking in the garden is an opportunity for friends/families in our congregation to reconnect with each other, the earth and God.

Check It Out! Come explore Covenant's Library! There are many books to Capture your imagination and help you grow along your spiritual journey—like this one:

Three Cups of Tea: One man's mission to promote peace...one school at a time by Greg Mortenson & David Relin. C2006

This biography is based on ten years of Greg Mortenson's life when he set out to climb a mountain & failed but succeeded in building schools for girls in Pakistan & Afghanistan. His rescue by Shiite tribesmen in the poor villages of the Karakoran Mts. gave him some lifelong friends & working companions.

This is a tale of relationships, trust & needs fulfilled by a man dedicated to a promise in gratitude for saving his life. The people of Balti had no school for the girls; they met outdoors; so Greg went home, raised money & returned to build one. One school led to another as other villages learned of this American & his work.

As Greg describes his daily life with the people, the book becomes a lesson in geography, sociology & history. There is excitement as he comes in contact with the Taliban & Al-Qaeda. There is concern as he lives in two worlds, Montana & Pakistan with a wife & two young children in the states & his work in another world.

Out of all this grew the non-profit organization Central Asia Institute by the people who support his work & new ones who continue to do so. His story appeared in "Parade" magazine in 2003 & some believe he could receive the Nobel Peace Prize sometime in the future.

The book has an Introduction, maps, acknowledgement (with suggestions for helping) & an index. It is one that is hard to lay down once started.
