

ADOPT the GARDEN...

Our Garden of Hope is aptly name and is coming along quite nicely. In fact it won't be long until we are harvesting cucumbers & tomatoes to support the Inter-Faith Food Shuttle as we feed the hungry in our community. Go to: http://www.foodshuttle.org to see how this all works.

We continue to seek volunteers for our "adopt the garden" program for a week. Individuals, families, groups take on responsibilities for the garden for a week. Depending on the time of the year and the weather, you may find yourself: watering the garden 3-4 times (every other day at least), picking and packing produce for Interfaith Food Shuttle (1-2 times per week), storing the produce in a safe place. There are also miscellaneous things like adding mulch, keeping the weeds out of the plant area, a tiny bit of mowing, continued beautification of the garden, etc. This is a chance for you to volunteer with minimal commitment even if you are super busy.

When's the last time you were invited to play in the dirt? It is so personally enriching to dig in the dirt and provide sustenance for the plants. Working in the garden is an opportunity for friends/families in our congregation to reconnect with each other, the earth and God. We even offer "hands-on training" so you will feel comfortable about what's expected.


