Sunday School Classes Begin New Year Sunday, September 7 at 10am

In order to get a driver's license, you must pass a test. In order for college & grad students, doctors, nurses, teachers, lawyers, CPAs, clergy, and all other professionals and practitioners, you must pass boards, tests, certifications and such to do so. And many professions require annual continuing education to be currently certified.

What if the Church required that you take some sort of Bible Test in order to be declared a practicing Christian; how would you fare? Why is it then, do you suppose, that so many of us find continuing education in the scriptures irrelevant, useless, unnecessary; and only at the very least, the right thing to do in order to be a "good" parent? Think about it and then make plans to attend the appropriate classes offered each Sunday at 10am:

- Nursery Care for Infants & Toddlers-same rooms—first 2 rooms on right
- Pre-School Class for 3 & 4 yr olds—same classroom-last room on right
- Younger Elementary for K-1st graders—same Classroom –second on left
- Older Elementary for 2nd-5th graders—first room on left

• Youth Class for grades 6-12—sanctuary

Adult Classes:

THE DISCIPLES CLASS WILL NOW MEET IN THE CHURCH LIBRARY off the sanctuary entrance. They use The Present Word series; a Bible based study that helps learners apply scriptures to everyday living and the world situation. Everyone receives a study book that allows you to keep pace with the class even when you need to be absent. Bob Kennel is the primary teacher but members of the class also periodically share teaching responsibilities.

SEEKERS CLASS WILL CONTINUE TO MEET in the last classroom on left (Youth Room) in the Education Wing. Currently they are discussing the assigned lessons of the Lectionary scriptures that coincide with those that are presented in morning worship. Ideas for forthcoming studies will be presented soon. Carole Tyler is the primary facilitator with several other class members who also lead the discussions.

HOT TOPICS CLASS WILL NOW MEET in the room opposite the Church Library off the sanctuary entrance. We look at contemporary moral issues and cultural concerns through the lens of our Christian faith. Beginning September 7, the class will share in a new five session study titled "Questioning Capital Punishment". Each session includes a 20 minute video presentation by Sr. Helen Prejean, a leading authority and outspoken critic of state-sponsored execution. A Roman Catholic Sister, Sr. Helen has ministered to numerous inmates on death row, and has authored two books based on those experiences, Dead Man Walking and The Death of Innocents: An Eyewitness Account of Wrongful Executions. She is the founder of the Death Penalty Discourse Center in New Orleans. Leadership is rotated among Craig Paul, Carolyn Allen, and Kathy Smith.

### LIBRARY CORNER

Never Let Me Go by Kazuo Ishiguro

This novel by the author of *The Returns of the Day* will hold your attention because it is about life in a world in which human cloning is legal.

Kathy at 31 relates her experience of growing up with her classmates at Hailsham, a private boarding school. Here children are raised for a special purpose in the world. The children become aware of being different but not how as they mature. Questions arise that seemed to be answered satisfactorily to the students but not to the reader. There is always a sense of "what is really going on here". Yet the children have fun, make friendships, and learn to enjoy art and nature.

One wonders who loves these children, who is in charge of the school and why. What is the purpose of this school and the children in it and all the other groups of children in other schools or institutions? It is a thought provoking book on a topic that may eventually receive much discussion.

We will now begin work on our congregational profile, the document that tells prospective ministers about Covenant, and establish a timeline for the process.

We also need your help. One thing John talked about was the potential to "network" to find candidates. The regional office will keep us posted on Disciples ministers who are actively seeking a position, but there are other ways of getting candidates, too. Do you know someone (or know someone who knows someone) who might be interested in working with the children and youth of Covenant as a Director of Youth and Children? Maybe they're affiliated with another denomination. Ask around. If someone is interested, please submit their name to me or another member of the Search Committee. We believe the right person is out there somewhere, and that God will help us find him or her.

Our next scheduled meetings are 6:30pm on Monday, September 8 and Thursday, September 18.
