We are called to welcome God's surprises as we hear the old, old story of this Baby born in Bethlehem with new ears and as we experience it once again with a new heart...Let the Advent Adventure begin and may our hearts be stirred... *Blessings, Joanne*

Notes from the November 16 General Board meeting:

- We are getting closer to having a new church sign to mark our entrance on Cary Parkway! The Board approved a v-shaped design that can be seen from both directions, the contract has been signed, and we are going through what we hope will be the final approval from the Town of Cary. Construction should begin in December...Stay tuned!
- The Congregational Meeting has been rescheduled to convene immediately following the 11:00 a.m. worship on Sunday, December 14.
 Please plan to be present for this important business meeting. Items to be brought before the congregation for approval are:
 - (1) Approval of the 2009 Budget
 - (2) Approval of a number of revisions and additions to the Constitution and By-Laws. It has been a number of years since we reviewed this document to ensure it reflects accurately how we live out our mission together at Covenant Christian Church (Disciples of Christ) today. There are several edits, updates and revisions to be considered together. The General Board has been studying these revisions for some months now and will submit them to you for action. The proposed changes were emailed (or mailed if you aren't on email) to you for your information and review the end of November.
- Various ministry and fellowship group reports were presented and will be addressed in other places in this newsletter.

There is much exciting activity around Covenant these days. We invite you to take full advantage of the fun, fellowship, beauty and worship of Advent that awaits you here at Covenant! Invite your friends to share in this special season with you.
