Imagine a Complaint Free World!

"Complaining is not to be confused with informing someone of a mistake or deficiency so that it can be put right. And to refrain from complaining doesn't necessarily mean putting up with bad quality or behavior. There is no ego in telling the waiter your soup is cold and needs to be heated up—if you stick to the facts, which are always neutral. 'How dare you serve me cold soup...?' That's complaining." -Eckhart Tolle

In July 2007, Dr. Sharon Watkins, our General Minister & President, introduced us to www.acomplaintfreeworld.com and the wearing of purple wristbands as a tool to help all of us curb our tendencies to complain about everything; always seeing the half-empty glass or the worst in everything.

At the beginning of this new year, I thought it would be a great idea to try and see if we can complain less and celebrate more. And so I handed out the purple bracelets in worship last Sunday. If you weren't here, not to worry...there's a bracelet waiting just for you!

Here's how it works: Scientists believe it takes 21 days to form a new habit and complaining is habitual for most of us. As Twain said, "we must coax our old behavior down the stairs." The purple bracelet is a powerful tool to remind us of how well we are creating a life with positive intention. Begin to wear the bracelet, on either wrist. When you catch yourself complaining, gossiping or criticizing (it's ok, everyone does) move the bracelet to the other arm and begin again.

If you hear someone else who is wearing a bracelet complain, you may point out their need to switch the bracelet to the other arm; BUT if you're going to do this, you must move your bracelet first! Stay with it. It may take many months but when you reach 21 days you will find that your entire life is happier, more loving and more enjoyable and this is surely to spill over into our shared life here at Covenant.

Congregational Business:

I want to thank Vice Moderator Brad Baldwin for presiding in my absence at the December 14th Congregational Meeting. The congregation adopted a \$250,928 Operating Budget for 2009. This budget has a higher percentage of support from documented estimates of giving than any budget in the last three years. This is indeed good news in these difficult economic times.

We were not able to address the proposed changes in the Constitution and By-Laws at this meeting, so please stay tuned for a called Congregational Meeting within the next several months. If you did not receive an emailed or mailed copy of the proposed changes and a copy of the current documents, please call the church office and ask for copies to be sent to you. I urge you to study these proposed changes and be ready with your questions and to take action when this meeting is called.

The Associate Minister Search Committee continues their work and a report will be forthcoming in January. The General Board meeting is scheduled for January 18 immediately following the 11:00 a.m. worship service

Reverend Dr. Sharon E. Watkins, General Minister & President of the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ) Selected to Give Sermon at the National Prayer Service

The Presidential Inaugural Committee announced today that General Minister & President Dr. Sharon E. Watkins of the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ) has been selected to give the sermon at the National Prayer Service on Wednesday, January 21st. The National Prayer Service will be held at the National Cathedral at the conclusion of Inaugural activities and will celebrate America's diversity of faith. Reverend Dr. Sharon Watkins will be the first woman to deliver the sermon at this traditional Inaugural event. The National Prayer Service, a tradition dating back to George Washington, will include prayers, readings and hymns delivered by religious leaders spanning a diverse array of faiths.

She came to the attention of Mr. Obama at a meeting he held during the campaign last summer to introduce himself to a politically and theologically diverse group of ministers. At that closed-door meeting, some of the conservative ministers bluntly questioned Mr. Obama on certain issues. Ms. Watkins was asked to give the closing prayer. "Sharon was able to conclude in a way that tied everyone together," said the Rev. Joshua DuBois, director of religious affairs for the Presidential Inaugural Committee, who was at the meeting. "It left folks on a buoyant note, with a degree of hope and optimism that we could find some common ground."

"We really emphasize the responsibility as well as the freedom of individuals within the church to study Scripture to prayerfully pursue their own spiritual journey," Ms. Watkins said. "That means we end up being incredibly diverse politically, theologically and socially. "Coming out of that context, the kind of message I want to reflect on is the deeper unity we have as a human family," she said of the sermon she planned to deliver at the National Cathedral.

The sermon will be 10 to 15 minutes and will not be vetted by the Obama team, Ms. Watkins said. She added that she would preach in a way that was authentic to her Christian tradition but did not exclude people of other faiths. The service is traditionally attended by the president and vice president; members of the Supreme Court, Congress and the diplomatic corps; and a host of clergy members and dignitaries.

The National Cathedral is the seat of the Episcopal Diocese of Washington, but it often serves as the church of the nation. The Rev. Billy Graham delivered a prayer at the service the day after the second inauguration of President Bush.

"I am truly honored to speak at this historic occasion," said Reverend Watkins. "My prayer when I preach is always that God will use me to bring a Gospel message that is uplifting and appropriately challenging to those who hear it. I hope that my message will call us to believe in something bigger than ourselves and remind us to reach out to all of our neighbors to build communities of possibility."

Reverend Dr. Sharon E. Watkins has served as our General Minister and President of the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ) in the United States and Canada since 2005. She is the first woman to hold this position. As General Minister of the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ), she is the general pastor of the 700,000-member denomination. As General President, she is the chief executive officer for the denomination, responsible for overseeing the work of the church's various structures. She is serving a sixyear term that extends through 2011.
