Fasting & Feasting...the Paradox of Lent

Quite early in life, thanks mostly to the Roman Catholic influence of my mother's family and some of my childhood friends, I was introduced to the idea of needing to "give up" something for Lent. It wasn't enough just to eat fish on Fridays, I was expected to do without something that I really liked or absolutely loved until Easter. As years passed I wasn't always committed to this tradition; and at other times, I used Lent as an excuse for losing weight and would give up most everything but rabbit food! ©

Early on in my ministry I was confronted with this whole idea all over again. So I used it as a teaching tool with my youth group...we researched Lent and its history and came to understand that as we prepared to move through Lent it would be more meaningful to "take on" some discipline or practice that would make us better people; to focus more on filling our lives with good things. During that same time I came across the following anonymous prayer and together with the youth, we made it our own. I share it with all of you in the hope that you might also make it your own prayer as we journey to Jerusalem and beyond...

Holy God, May I

FAST from judging others; and FEAST on the Christ within them.

FAST from emphasis on differences; FEAST on celebrating our diversity.

FAST from apparent darkness; FEAST on the reality of light.

FAST from thoughts of illness; FEAST on the healing power of God.

FAST from words that condemn; FEAST on words that praise.

FAST from discontent; FEAST on gratitude.

FAST from anger; FEAST on patience.

FAST from pessimism; FEAST on optimism.

FAST from worry: FEAST on trusting God more.

FAST from complaining; FEAST on appreciation.

FAST from negatives; FEAST on affirmatives.

FAST from unrelenting pressures; FEAST on unceasing prayer.

FAST from hostility: FEAST on nonresistance.

FAST from bitterness: FEAST on forgiveness.

FAST from self-concern; FEAST on compassion for others.

FAST from personal anxiety; FEAST on eternal Truth.

FAST from discouragement; FEAST on hope.

FAST from lethargy; FEAST on enthusiasm.

FAST from suspicion; FEAST on truth.

FAST from hatred and FEAST on love.

FAST from thoughts that weaken or destroy; FEAST on building up one another.

FAST from shadows of sorrow; FEAST on the sunlight of serenity.

FAST from idle gossip; FEAST on purposeful silence.

Let's FEAST on all the possibilities of a joy-filled life as we seek to know the fullness of God's love, grace and mercy...Blessings, Joanne

Outreach Ministry News

Each month Local Outreach Ministry is sharing information about one of the agencies we support. North Carolina Interfaith Power and Light (NCIP & L) is one of the agencies that the Outreach Committee partners with and supports. Strange name, isn't it? But, when you understand the mission of the organization the name makes perfect sense. This North Carolina group is part of a national organization (Interfaith Power and Light) with branches in 28 states. And, it is an interfaith group, working with diverse faith communities to help them protect God's creation through the conservation of.....power and light! Viola'.....North Carolina Interfaith Power and Light!!

NCIP &L focuses on helping congregations learn ways to protect the earth from the effects of global warming and to plan for a greener future. This work includes educating their members in a number of ways. They provide energy audits, assistance implementing recommendations that result from the audit, a speakers bureau, offering workshops, and a lending library. They even have an online store for energy efficient products that provides congregations with high quality, deeply discounted conservation options.

NCIP&L has conducted an energy audit for Covenant and provided us with the results and recommendations on ways to be more environmentally aware as well as saving energy. It was through their speakers bureau that we had Ms. Alice Lloyd speak to Covenant and conduct a workshop. They are a valuable resource as we continue the "greening" of Covenant.

Covenant's Outreach Ministry has always taken seriously our mission to those in need throughout Wake County NCIP & L is helping us expand our mission to include the environment as we put our faith into action, "Caring for God's Green Earth..."

God's Green Earth

Simple Ways to Save Energy from Green America

- 1. Unplug or turn off lights and equipment not in use. If it is lit, it is using power.
- 2. Do not heat or cool rooms you do not use.
- 3. Let the dishwasher breathe use "air dry" or leave the door open overnight.
- 4. Shift load to off peak times if possible. Run the dishwasher during the night.
- 5. Fill empty spaces in the refrigerator with bottles of water (water retains cold better than air). Clean coils every six months.
- 6. Wash clothes in cold water but if killing dust mites, wash in hot and rinse in cold.
- 7. Give the dryer a rest use a rack or clothes line. Avoid wrinkles by using the dryer for 5 minutes and then hang the clothes.

According to Ideal Green Bite:

Each year, Americans toss out enough paper and plastic cups, forks, spoons to circle the equator 300 times if laid end-to-end. Dishwashing takes less water than producing new disposables.

SO --- return to washable utensils wherever possible including:

Dishes; Napkins; Glasses; Mugs; Placemats; Tablecloths; Dishtowels;; Storage containers; Water bottles

WHERE --- Home; Restaurants; Bars; Wherever you eat or drink.

OR --- Use bioplastics marked biodegradable or compostable with # 7 such as compostable bowls, plates, platters made from corn, sugar, fallen leaves and recycled paper products. Check out VerTerra.com and biodegradable store.com for more information.

YOU may not be able to do all of this immediately but tackle one item at a time until it becomes habit.
