- (2) The General Board has approved the Memorial and Honor Funds Policy to help guide our process for receiving and disbursing these funds.
- (3) All the Ministry Groups are hard at work and you may read about many of their activities elsewhere in this newsletter.

And finally...I am VERY HAPPY to report our new church sign is installed and lighted, so drive by at night and appreciate the two-year saga of working with the Town of Cary to get it approved and installed; and take time to THANK DEBBIE MILLER for her patience, perseverance and determination in making it happen!

2009 Financial Plan Status

As you recall from the February 15 congregational meeting, the congregation agreed to a fourpoint financial plan with actions to support our growth in staff, programs, and membership. Below you'll find an update on each of those action items:

Action 1: Increase gifts and pledges from within the congregation.

- 23 gifts and pledges received = \$9,258 (\$3,953 cash received, \$5,305 pledges to be paid by December 31, 2009) -- 58% of our goal
- 27 Grow with Covenant cards returned with either increased pledges, commitments to work at a fundraiser, or both.

Action 2: Unbind the Gospel and grow our congregation

• Guests abound at Covenant as we strive to provide an open, inviting environment for all who worship at Covenant. The Senior Minister and Elders continue to grow the shepherding groups to make guests feel welcome and answer any questions they may have about spiritual life at Covenant.

Action 3: Raise funds with additional fundraisers.

- Special thanks to Debbie and Jerry Miller for sponsoring the wonderful barbecue fundraiser at their home. A total of 120 tickets were sold generating \$1,200 in profit, and a relaxing evening of fellowship was had by all who attended.
- Spring Daze Arts & Crafts Festival took place at Bond Park in Cary on April 25. Covenant's booth was staffed by volunteers with profits coming back to the church. Our net profit from this event is \$1,959.60
- Additional fundraisers have been presented to the Board and planning is underway for other fundraisers this year, including:
 - A pancake breakfast & plant sale
 - Script/gift card purchases with percentage of proceeds benefiting Covenant
 - Lazy Daze Arts & Crafts Festival, August 22; additional barbecue fundraisers hosted by Debbie and Jerry Miller

Action 4: Reduce budget and cover operating expenses with dedicated gifts where possible.

- The Board unanimously approved \$4,050 in budget reductions from spending cuts and dedicated gifts at the April 19 meeting.
- An additional \$4,800 is being examined by the financial task force for future reductions if necessary.


