



## **And Now a Word from Your Moderator**

### **New Building Updates**

Following the unanimous vote of the congregation at the Congregational Meeting on February 28 to move forward with the recommendations of the Facilities Evaluation and Planning Team (F.E.A.P. Team) to proceed with the \$1.2 million Phase I of Covenant's three-phase building plan and a \$400,000 capital campaign to help fund it, lots of activity has taken place to position us to do just that.

Phase I includes a new 250 seat sanctuary with baptistery, changing rooms, a communion preparation room, additional men's and women's rest rooms and changes to the administrative office area. This will temporarily allow us to re-purpose existing worship space for multi-use space, to serve as fellowship hall and classrooms defined by movable divider panels until we are in a position to build Phase II.

Two new committees were immediately appointed and they have been hard at work during March preparing for the capital campaign and making pre-building plans such as preparing a request for proposals to hire an architect and receiving bids for the core drilling work that needs to happen as a first step. ## SCRIP FUNDRAISER!!

We are a few weeks into our new fundraising program, Scrip, and we have had fantastic interest in the program! Many people have stopped by the Scrip table to ask questions, figure out how they can participate in the program, take an order form home, and even place an order. As of March 15, 2010, we have earned \$115.13!

Scrip is a fantastic program where you purchase Scrip (substitute money) from Covenant Christian Church in the form of gift cards and gift certificates. Covenant has cards and certificates available from literally hundreds of retailers, local and national, physical stores and online shopping. Place your order with the Scrip Volunteers after either service on Sunday. The next Sunday your order will be available to be picked up!

Here are a few suggestions for helping you to figure out how you can participate. Do you or someone in your household use medication regularly? We offer Scrip from pharmacies such as CVS, Rite Aid, Sam's Club, Walgreen's, and Wal-Mart. Purchase your Scrip from Covenant ahead of time, and use that to purchase your prescription at the drug store. Do you frequently purchase your gasoline at the same gas station? We offer Scrip from BP Gas, Circle K, Exxon, Mobil, Sam's Club, Sheetz, Shell, and Texaco, just to name a few.

### CURRENT SPECIALS AND NEWS FROM GREAT LAKES SCRIP CENTER

- ❖ iTunes is temporarily increasing their contribution from 5% to 8%! This offer is good for scrip purchased between March 20, 2010 and April 16, 2010.
- ❖ Casual Male XL is increasing their contribution from 6% to 9%. This is a permanent change, effective on scrip purchased after March 27, 2010.
- ❖ The Great Lakes Scrip Center closes every year for one week in the spring for all their employees to take vacations. The GLSC will be closed from April 5 - April 9. **This means that orders placed at Covenant on April 4 will not be available until April 18.** This is the only time of the year that GLSC closes.

\*The "needed monthly income" represents the average amount necessary to cover our budgeted expenses. That is, since we anticipate that our total expenses for the year will be \$246,512, we need to average \$20,543 on a monthly basis to break even at year end.
