Covenant Christian Church is embarking on a journey in faith... to expand our capacity to serve and to meet future ministry needs.

Sunday, May 2, 2010, will be another historic day in the time line for Covenant Christian Church (Disciples of Christ)!! We kick off our "Opening New Doors... Stepping Out in Faith" capital campaign and pray for the campaign, the leaders on the campaign council who will guide us through the campaign period and for the vision set before us as we work together to make that vision a reality. Please plan to be present!

This campaign is about much more than raising funds for a building project. A capital campaign in a congregation is a faith-based spiritual act, as well as a financial effort. We have spent several years in study and discernment to better articulate our mission, beliefs and statement of calling. Through this campaign, we will place our resources in the service of the dream to which we feel God is calling us.

Our spiritual goal: We seek to expand our capacity to nurture the faith development of and to better serve current and future families and individuals.

Our financial goal: We seek to raise \$400,000 over a three-year period to add to the \$150,000 we have received in gifts or saved over the last few years for our next building project. This amount will position us to qualify for the loan which will enable us to embark on a \$1.2 million building project.

Our building goal: We seek to build a free-standing sanctuary that will seat 250 worshippers and a 30-40 member choir, and will include a baptistery, changing rooms, communion preparation room, and rest rooms; additionally, we plan to repurpose our current multi-purpose building for fellowship and classrooms and reconfigure administrative space to better serve our needs.

MAY has been designated Covenant's campaign month. Throughout the month our leaders will guide us in preparation for **Commitment Sunday**, **May 23rd...** appropriately the day of Pentecost, the celebration of the birthday of the church. On that day we will bring our estimate of giving cards forward to be dedicated. I am pleased to be able to report to you that your General Board and the Campaign Council have already made their commitments to support the campaign and the total dollars raised to date will be announced on *Kick Off* Sunday. *Celebration Sunday* will be held on June 6th with a celebratory cake and punch and the results of the campaign will be announced to the congregation.

I encourage you to prayerfully consider a stretch gift to help make Covenant's vision come true as we prepare throughout the month for Commitment Sunday. How can YOU help us along the stepping stones and across the threshold into our future of worship and service? Won't you join your leaders in *Opening New Doors and Stepping Out in Faith*?



Local Outreach Interested in a "Hands-On" Outreach Project?

The Helen Wright Center for Women (of Urban Ministries of Wake County works to reduce homelessness by providing temporary housing and support services. They maintain a transitional shelter for women that provides their basic needs as well as case management to help move them towards independence and permanent housing. To keep this ministry vital many helping hands are needed. One way that churches can become involved is to help in providing evening meals and Saturday lunches. The women of Covenant have the opportunity to provide a Saturday lunch. We would prepare the meal at the Church and then take it to the shelter and serve it there. Interested? Hints from The Green Team:

Do you opt for paper or plastic when at the grocery store? Neither is a good choice. Twelve million barrels of oil were used to make the 88.5 billion plastic bags consumed in the United States last year. And it takes four times more energy to make paper bags. The best choice is reusable shopping bags made of cotton, nylon or durable, mesh-like plastic. Put a few reusable shopping bags in your car so you have them handy on your next shopping trip. And if you happen to forget your reusable bag (as we all do!), choose paper if you will recycle it or plastic if you will reuse or recycle it. Don't forget there are Covenant canvas bags for sale for grocery shopping and Covenant nylon bags for others needs!

Stop buying bottled water!

Did you know that it takes 26 bottles of water to produce the plastic container for a one-liter bottle of water, and that doing so pollutes 25 liters of groundwater? Don't leave a trail of plastic water bottles in your wake! Stop buying bottled water. Use reusable water bottles instead made from materials like stainless steel or aluminum that are not likely to degrade over time. If you choose a plastic water bottle, check the number on the bottom first: Plastics numbered 3, 6 and 7 could pose a health threat to you, so look for plastics numbered 1, 2, 4 or 5.

Stop Receiving Unwanted Catalogs

Each year, 19 billion catalogs are mailed to American consumers. All those catalogs require more than 53 million trees and 56 billion gallons of wastewater to produce -- and many of us don't even know how we got on so many mailing lists! So grab that stack of catalogs piling up on your coffee table and clear out the clutter. Visit www.CatalogChoice.org to put a stop to unwanted catalogs. Within 10 weeks, your mailbox will be empty of unwanted catalogs. A less cluttered mailbox means less pollution, less waste and less of the pollution that causes global warming.
