A Call to Be Wisdom Bearers

I would like to think that I am a Wisdom Seeker...not looking for advice when needed, but wisdom. Advice never ceases to be in abundance; with lots of folks lurking around every corner; simply ready to offer advice at any given moment, whether asked for or not. And more often than not, while the advice may be free, it comes with an even greater price! People tend to offer advice without much thought and if you dare to follow it, it may not be exactly what you need.

Advice may be based on one's experience; one's accumulated learning; but it is not necessarily wisdom. Wisdom is more than this because it also involves the ability to discern inner qualities and relationships...Wisdom is related to intuition...a sense of knowing...

Wisdom in the scriptures is found in the Book of Proverbs and the Wisdom literature of Solomon. In the Book of Proverbs, Wisdom is a woman: "The Lord created me at the beginning of the Lords work. (Prov. 8:22). She was there when the Lord made the heaven, the sea, the earth..." Wisdom includes imagination; a matter not only of the mind but of the intuition and heart..." (Frederick Buechner, *Whistling in the Dark; pg. 112*)

- And as my dear friend and mentor since seminary days, Dr. James Seale, began to decline in health and now has died, I have spent much time reflecting on our 32 years of shared experiences in ministry. He has guided me from those early days until now, with insight and guidance in areas of ministry that "they" just don't get around to teaching you in seminary! And he's never failed me; even during those times when I didn't want to listen! Wisdom lives on in my bones!

I am excited about serving in this position as the momentum our congregation has generated within our ministries and through the capital campaign will bring us new opportunities in the coming weeks and months. These opportunities will help us grow closer together spiritually as we attempt to expand our church's physical capacity to serve.

I want to take a moment to thank Karen Nolan for her tremendous contributions to the life of Covenant over the past year and a half as our Moderator. With Karen's guidance and leadership, we have made great strides in so many areas, and I think I speak for many when I say that her dedication and tireless efforts are greatly appreciated. Thank you Karen!

A brief update on the capital campaign and Building committee progress over the past few weeks...

- Celebration Sunday was held after both worship services on June 6 as we celebrated the pledges made to the campaign for a new sanctuary and existing space renovation. Contributions continue to come in, and as of mid-June we have received 79 pledges totaling \$236,000+ over three years. Thank you very much to those who have given to the capital campaign; and for those who are prayerfully considering their gift!
- The Building Committee has completed face-to-face interviews with four architectural firms that are interested in Covenant's building project. The committee will now evaluate each of the firms, check references, and ultimately recommend an architect with whom we should work on our building project. A decision from the committee is expected in early July.

As work continues on the building expansion front, we also have an important meeting coming up in which everyone in the congregation is encouraged to participate.

On **Saturday**, **July 17 from 8:30a-12:30p** we will be holding our annual Churchwide Planning meeting at the church. This meeting sets the direction and goals for the coming year for each of Covenant's ministries -- Education, Invitation, Membership & Hospitality, Outreach, Property, Stewardship, Worship as well as the Men's and Women's ministries.

The more people we have participating in this planning discussion, the clearer our direction becomes as we all come together to share our talents and gifts with one another and our community. I encourage you to take part and participate in setting the direction for the ministries if you are able. Childcare is available upon request.

Women's Ministries News







Covenant's SCRIP Update

In the first three months of the SCRIP program at Covenant, we are averaging \$143.13 earned each month. That average puts us on track to earn over \$1400 this year alone! More than \$8,000 of SCRIP has been purchased by 23 households, either by placing an order or purchasing the on-site inventory. Thank you to everyone who has already participated!! SCRIP is an **on-going** program at Covenant - so it is not too late to give it a try. SCRIP volunteers will be staying after the Church-wide Planning Meeting on July 17 to answer questions and help fill out orders for anyone who is interested.

LOOKING AHEAD

Summer is a great time for cold treats. Baskin Robbins and Cold Stone Creamery both participate in the SCRIP program. There are numerous drug stores, like CVS, Walgreens, and Rite Aid for bug spray and sunscreen for those outdoor activities.

Travelling this summer? Over 25 hotel chains participate in the SCRIP program, including Marriott Hotels and Hyatt Hotels. Don't forget school starting again this fall – now is the time to plan ahead for those back-to-school supplies (like Kmart, Walmart, Staples, Office Depot, Office Max) and back-to-school clothes (like Kohl's, Walmart, JCPenney, T.J. Maxx, Belk).
