Important Building Committee (Jpdate!

The Building Committee has determined that we should use a "team build" approach for the new sanctuary. With this approach, the architect and builder are brought on board early in the process, and work together in the design. By having the builder on board early, we have more control over the building costs.

We have selected an architect (ADW Architects in Charlotte) and have been meeting with them almost weekly. We have also selected a building contractor: Clancy & Theys of Raleigh. Both ADW and Clancy & Theys are working together to develop preliminary schematic drawings, which will then be presented with pricing information to the Building Committee for review and discussion.

The Schematic Drawings will be available for your viewing pleasure at our celebration dinner following 11am worship on Anniversary Sunday, November 14th. You'll want to be present this day Don Downs, Building Committee Chr. as the current plans and schedules will be discussed.
