So as Thanksgiving Day passes and the leftovers no longer take up space in my refrigerator, I will find myself jumping right into the holiday spirit by dragging down the Christmas boxes from the attic; rearranging the furniture to make room for the tree; unpacking the mantle decorations and placing them in no particular order for the moment; making room for the Christmas china; and actually getting the tree up—sans lights & ornaments more than likely. For those of you who think I am way too fussy about the chairs in the sanctuary each week—don't even bother to stop by my house until the all clear has been sounded when the lights are finally to *my* satisfaction! \odot

So...let the season begin. Who can stop it anyway? But as it unfolds, each of one of us needs to figure out which things we can have control over concerning the speed and intensity of the weeks ahead. We are called to welcome God's surprises as we hear the old, old story of this Baby born in Bethlehem with new ears and as we experience it once again with a new heart...

Take time to read through this holiday edition of the newsletter so you can be here to celebrate this holy season as part of our community of faith.

Alternative Christmas Ideas

*Remember to recycle and purchase your "Covenant Goes Green" **environmentally friendly cloth & nylon bags**—they make great gifts and gift wraps.

*Heifer International: Through purchasing animals in honor of a friend or loved one, you empower families to become self-sustaining and to share their knowledge and the offspring with other families in their villages as a way to end the cycle of poverty. As quoted by former president Jimmy Carter: "Heifer has inspired hope in hungry communities, where the gift of one animal can bring health, prosperity and peace." You can simply go to www.heifer.org to view the catalog and place your order.

*Urban Ministries of Wake County Christmas Card project:

You can purchase a beautiful card with a local artist's painting on the front and a message inside that informs the recipient that in their honor a gift has been given to provide comfort to families living in poverty during this season of sharing. Cards will be available to purchase for \$5.00 each before/ after morning worship starting on December 5.

*WeCare Christmas Trees: You can purchase a Frazier fir tree from Ashe County, freshly cut December 3, that will be delivered to the church, thanks to Ken Hoffman, on December 5. This program goes to support needy families in Ashe County. There is an order form with instructions on the table in the entryway. The trees need to be prepaid and the checks need to be given to Tim/Becky Stiles or placed in the envelope provided on the table. All orders need to be placed by December 1.

TIPS FOR A "GREEN" CHRISTMAS

- 1. **Wrap Presents in Fabric and Forgo the Box**: If you feel the need to wrap presents, which does create some wonder in children's eyes, try wrapping presents in fabric. Fabric is reusable and less likely to be tossed in a landfill after the presents are opened. You can find less expensive fabric that has already been cut into "fat quarters" at fabric stores, as well as thrift stores. Left over fabric wrapping "paper" is great for later kid crafts and quilting. If offered a box from a retailer to place your present in before wrapping, decline this extra packaging. The more we reduce, the less waste we create.
- 2. Decorate a Live Christmas Tree: Every holiday season, we see lot after lot of cut down trees. Many of these trees go to waste, and even those that come home with families end up in incinerators or landfills. The alternative is to buy a potted tree or, or dig one up in the forest. You can take advantage of live Christmas tree shopping to buy a new tree for your yard. Shop native plant nurseries to find the perfect species to replant after the holidays.
 - According to <u>LiveEarth.org</u>, "A single tree can absorb more than one ton of CO2 over its lifetime." If you don't have room on your property for a tree or you rent your home, you can plant your tree in a friend's yard or a national forest (along as you chose a native species). Click <u>here</u> for tips on caring for a live Christmas tree. Live trees can be expensive, and there is even a <u>company that rents live trees</u> to families for the holidays.
- 3. Ship Directly From Online and Catalog retailers: If you make purchases online or from catalogs, chose to ship the presents directly to the receiver. By shipping them directly, you will save money by not having to ship the gift twice (once to you, and once to the receiver). The money saved can be used to purchase gift wrapping from the retailer, if you feel that is necessary. You will reduce your carbon footprint for the holiday by not having your gifts be transported twice. If you must ship packages, use US Postal Service Priority Mail or Express Mail packaging. The Postal Service is committed to finding new ways to protect the environment and is the first in its industry to receive this certification." At least our government is doing one thing right.
- 4. **Decorate with Homemade Items and Hand-Me-Down Ornaments:** Kristen Chase, of <u>Cool Mom Picks</u> and the <u>League of Maternal Justice</u> suggests using cranberries or the traditional popcorn for decorations.
- 5. **Buy Gifts That Count:** We all have people on our lists we feel obligated to buy a gift for who really don't need anything. These can be challenging gifts to buy, and often, these gifts end up in second hand stores or landfills. To meet the challenge, think about giving gifts that count, such as carbon credits from TerraPass or a charitable gift to Heifer International.
- 6. And of course, a donation to Covenant Christian Church in honor of a loved one makes a perfect Christmas gift as well! Also, think of ways to give gifts without spending money as you share special time together out of your busy life with a loved one.

Prepare Now for the New Year: Automatic Bill Pay...A Convenient Way to Regularly Make Your Tithes & Offerings

We also want to encourage any members/guests to setup **automatic bill pay** with their bank so that a check is sent to us each week or month, whether or not you are able to be in worship. The information that you need when setting up an automatic payment is as follows:
