Back to the Future

While this might evoke memories of an enjoyable film, it also has significance for us here at Covenant as we look back to our earliest of beginnings and at the same time take courage as we move into the future that God has in store for us. The yearlong celebration of our 25th Anniversary began on January 23 in grand style. A special thanks to the Anniversary Committee for making all of this possible.

At 10a, we spent time listening & asking questions as Glenn Carson, President, shared stories and information about the Disciples of Christ Historical Society. DCHS is the general unit of the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ) that is responsible for collecting and safe-guarding the history of the Disciples of Christ from its frontier founding in the early 1800's; and the stories of each congregation and region.

During 11a worship, Glenn Carson and I enjoyed sharing an interview-style message of how the hallmarks of the Disciples of Christ have unfolded here at Covenant from our earliest of years. Some of those we explored were:

- Christian Unity—our desire to cooperate and serve with other denominations as well as other faith
 traditions; the welcoming spirit and acceptance of ALL of God's children to worship and share life
 together; our oneness in Christ as we gather about the Table--believing that Christ is the host at God's
 Welcome Table; and ALL are welcome!
- Celebrating diversity;
- Our generosity as we serve those in need here and around the world;
- Growing in our understanding of prayer and spirituality as we seek God's wisdom and guidance for this community of faith;
- and last but not least, our ability to enjoy God and to enjoy one another.

Later on that same day, we gathered to share and hear stories about the first 2 years of our founding. We were hosts to 20+ folks who came to touch base with their initial investments of faith, time, talent and money as they sought then to capture God's vision of beginning the first new church in our region in over 25 years. They reminisced about how we went from being a gleam in the eye of our regional leaders and congregations to the demographic study that chose the Cary area as the site for this new church start; to the calling of Rev. Bob Mooty as the Pastor-Developer; to the first gathering of friends and soon-to-be members who laid the foundation for what we now call Covenant Christian Church (Disciples of Christ).

What a great evening of delicious food; lively conversation and the sharing of so many stories...what a wonderful testimony of faith and commitment as living witnesses of all that continues to shape us as this faith community, even now.

Words from two pieces of music offered so beautifully by our choir that morning sum up Covenant's journey of faith thus far along the way. From the opening chorus: "We've come this far by faith, leaning on the Lord..." and from the anthem by Pepper Choplin: "I'll declare with every breath: Your love is sure through every test...I'll make known Your faithfulness...to every generation..."

We celebrate a great legacy of faith as Covenant Christian Church. And I am grateful for everyone who has come our way, leaving footprints, large and small, member, guest or a die-hard fan, for a few months or a few years or many years. I am grateful for YOU and how GOD continues to richly bless us, revealing God's ongoing vision; giving us all that we need and exactly when we need it...


