Making a List and Checking It Twice...

...gonna find out who's naughty or nice...As a child, and probably if I'm honest, as an adult, I had good reason to worry about which list I would find my name on! And then as I entered Jr. High and High School, there were lists I scoured, hoping beyond all hope to find my name: final tryout selections for school dramas; or sports teams; honor roll; good citizenship (is there such a list these days)?; and then in college the professors would post exam grades on a list outside his/her office door and you either breathed a sigh of relief or you knew it would be summer school for sure!

As I run the word "list" through my head today, I think of: shopping list; to-do list; check-list; listserve; play list; Franz Liszt ©; Christmas gift list; Christmas card list; bucket list; birthday/anniversary lists; guest list; donor list; worst or best dressed lists...and on it goes.

When I made my first visit to New York City as a teenager, I remember visiting Ellis Island and seeing all the lists of names of those who had come to the United States, most of whom were seeking a better life; and then on family vacations I also remember seeing the lists of names etched in various war memorials and historic battlefields around our country and around the world. And then there's "Schindler's List" with the names of those who were saved from being put on the trains going to Auschwitz; while others read list upon list of those who died there and in other concentration camps during WWII.

Just this week, I saw a photo on the Week of Compassion website taken in one city in Japan that was hardest hit in the earthquake/tsunami of recent weeks. Families are searching for the names of loved ones on a list of missing and those confirmed dead...not unlike the lists throughout New Orleans after Hurricane Katrina; or after and immediately following the earthquake in Haiti...hoping beyond all hope, not knowing if you really wanted to find the names of your loved ones, unless it was among the survivors.

A conference I attended sometime ago began with the following instructions for our introductory small groups: "You are stranded on a desert island. A box washes ashore. In that box are 7 items. They are, much to your amazement, the very 7 things you need most to live. List those 7 items AND what makes them necessary..."

In addition to the more obvious things needed to sustain our physical needs, i.e. water; food; housing; chocolate...what else would be on your list and why? I would take this exercise a bit further and ask what things are needed to sustain our spiritual needs, i.e. peace of mind; prayer; love, etc. What would be on your spiritual needs list and why?

As we journey through these next few weeks of Lent; preparing to revisit the events of the week we call, Holy; and preparing yet even more to awaken to the joy of Easter dawn...we are reminded of God's miracle of Christ's resurrection filled to overflowing with the hope-secure of everlasting life...

From time to time in these last few weeks of Lent, I will stop and rest along the way to consider what spiritual needs would be found inside that box that has just washed ashore and is bobbing about my feet planted in the surf. And then I will go just a bit deeper and reflect on what exactly makes them the very things I need most to live...

How 'bout you? Isn't it time to be making that list and checking it twice?...

#### **Disciples Mission Fund**

As we continue through Lent and approach Easter Sunday we will be collecting a special Easter offering that goes to benefit the General Ministries of the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ). I wanted to provide an update on how the special offerings that Covenant collects tie in to our church's contributions to the General Church.

Our goal at Covenant is to give 10% of our congregation's gifts to Disciples Mission Fund, or DMF. Disciples Mission Fund is our denomination's common mission effort that supports ministries such as new church starts, Disciples educational institutions, camps, and Disciples general ministries to name a few. These ministries are done at the local, regional and global level.

Covenant's contribution to DMF is achieved by giving 100% of our congregation's donations to five special offerings collected throughout the year -- Pentecost, Easter, Thanksgiving, Christmas, and Reconciliation. Historically these 5 special offerings have accounted for about 2% of Covenant's giving to the General Church. The remaining 8% of our giving to DMF comes directly from our General Fund budget.

In addition to the special offerings and General Fund contributions to the Disciples Mission Fund, 100% of the offerings Covenant collects for Week of Compassion goes to support disaster relief efforts led by our denomination. In the past two years Covenant has given over \$10,000 to Week of Compassion disaster relief efforts.

Your contributions to Covenant and the greater Disciples Mission Fund efforts help each of us to reach people beyond the immediate world around us. If you have any questions about Covenant's contribution to DMF, feel free to contact me.
