July brings with it many things: barbecues, fireworks, vacations, and the occasional sunburn! Here at Covenant, it also brings a new group of leaders and officers, as we thank those who have served and welcome those who are beginning and continuing to serve our congregation.

Many thanks to Derek Rutledge, our outgoing moderator, and to all of those individuals who have helped lead in the past year. Your time, talent, effort, and energy have been well spent and appreciated!

In recent months, we've read and heard a lot about the operating needs of Covenant. We've engaged in small group discussions and come away with great ideas for fundraising, awareness-raising, and fellowship.

As people of faith, we know that our resources are not our own, but sometimes we might wonder how we can help the church we love if we're already giving everything we can. Here are some easy suggestions:

Pray for our church, making this faith community part of your conversation with God.

- Give thanks for fundraisers! The recent plant sale raised \$831—nearly enough to cover our budgeted administrative expenses for one month. Spring Daze raised \$2700, over half our annual education ministry cost. And our SCRIP program has raised about \$1300 so far this year; covering our annual budget for music and worship suppl Give thanks for fundraisers! - Use SCRIP. By purchasing a \$50 Exxon or BP card and using it to fill up your tank, you give \$.75 to Covenant. That doesn't sound like much, until you think about the number of times you might spend \$50 on gas in a month or a year... And \$50 at Target nets \$1 for Covenant. It all adds up!

There are new fundraisers coming too along with more opportunities for fellowship and fun, including VBS on July 27-30 and an Ice Cream Social on July 31.

News from the Financial Task Force

May was a strong month financially for Covenant. Our income exceeded expenses by nearly \$7,300 The income from Spring Daze was \$2700; and we received approximately \$5000 in over and above giving or from pledges being paid ahead of schedule. We've reduced the General Fund shortfall for the year to just under \$11,700, but we need to continue to press on and maintain momentum so we can continue to reduce our deficit and overcome our operating budget challenges.
