performances and yes, even Opera \odot ...to a concert featuring the Rascals and The Shondells! Over the past 3 weeks my ears and heart were treated to music by the classical masters & hymn tunes of the 18th & 19th centuries to the classic popular music of the 1960's...Whew!

The week at Chautauqua was filled with worship, lectures, drama & music that expressed the theme for our week: *Art & Soul.* Dr. Welton Gaddy, Pastor for Preaching & Worship, Northminster Baptist Church, Monroe, LA was the guest preacher each morning; presenting us with messages centered on *The Art of Faith and the Faith of Art.* One of his messages, *Sing Me a Song*, included a story about a group of Afghan children who had never before heard music— not because they were hearing impaired; they simply had not ever heard music. Can you imagine? Never having heard music of any kind...Perhaps it would be easier to understand if you and I had never heard music in the first place. But how sad and empty I feel thinking about anyone living without the gift of music.

Music...the universal gift that has the capacity to rise above all our human differences and allow us to celebrate our diversity...united the gathered spirits at both General Assembly and Chautauqua. It's music that re-confirms my belief in the innate goodness of human creation; that we have the same basic needs; the same basic desires; the same basic hopes for the future and all people around the world...Music is a gift from our generous God, providing us with pleasure that transports us to a higher plain...

And then to return home and be dropped smack-dab in the throes of Vacation Bible School, only to see and hear the gathered spirits of our children singing songs that celebrate the goodness of God, the beauty of our diversity and oneness as God's sons & daughters...every night dancing & singing from the souls of their feet all the way beyond the tips of their little fingers up to the heavens...

And then to have them join us for morning worship, only to once again share God's love in song and dance with us...a sermon unto itself to be sure...the innocence of childhood with crystal clear voices, expressive faces & gestures; smiles and joy-filled eyes, reminding us to fill our lives with the joy of music...God's gift to a weary and hurting world; God's gift that blesses our pain & suffering; that causes our spirits to soar to greater heights, rising above our human differences, to see the face of God...Blessings, Rev. Our Financial Picture

And now a word from our Treasurer...

Two steps forward...one step back...After a strong month of May, we are happy to report that General Fund contributions remained right on target for June! However...largely due to several bills which are paid quarterly rather than monthly, expenses were slightly over budget, resulting in a shortfall of \$3K for June.

Preliminary figures for July indicate that GF contributions are down, with a shortfall of \$5K for the month. While this is not unusual for the summer, we ask that you make every effort to remember Covenant, even when vacation plans keep you out of town. We will continue to monitor monthly expenses. Covenant's SCRIP Update

Have you tried the new online ordering program for SCRIP? It is called ShopwithScrip and it allows you to order your SCRIP online. (Don't worry – we will continue to provide the on-site inventory for immediate purchase and the ability to submit orders in person – this is just another avenue for you to participate in SCRIP.) Several families have already starting using the program – they have been able to submit orders even when they aren't at church and purchase SCRIP instantly through ScripNow! (a part of ShopwithScrip).

For those of you who have been using ShopwithScrip, the shopping cart is now "persistent" – meaning the items in your shopping cart will be saved until the next time you log in and/or until you submit your order. You no longer have to fill your shopping cart and pay for it all in the same session.
