Celebrating 40 Years of Ministry!

Last Sunday as we closed out the Week of the Ministry, we honored Rev. Joanne for her 40 years in ministry, including the 32nd anniversary of her ordination. In addition to a new robe as a gift from family and friends, our Covenant family presented her with a gift as described in Darla's presentation:

When Joanne L. VerBurg was in college, she went on a spiritual retreat. While there, God invited her to consider minister as her vocation. What we know today is that, not only did Joanne accept God's invitation, but she embraced the call to ministry as a framework for moving into the future that God would unfold for her. That journey led her to the door of the first church she would serve in Nashville, TN. That event happened November 1, 1971 – 40 years ago, so last Sunday, the congregation recognized this milestone in her career by presenting her with gifts from family and friends and by offering prayers of thanksgiving for all she and God have experienced thus far on their journey together.

Moderator, Darla Baldwin made the following presentation from the congregation:

"The number 40 is a significant number in the Bible: The Israelites wandered in the wilderness for 40 years; Moses was on the mountain with God for 40 days; the great flood for which Noah built the ark was caused by 40 days and nights of rain; and Jesus was tempted in the wilderness for 40 days (Some scholars say this period is affiliated with probation and trial, followed by renewal and revival). WE ARE HAPPY TO SAY THAT YOUR PROBATIONARY PERIOD IS OVER!"

"We at Covenant Christian Church are fortunate to have had you as our minister, leader, confidant, advisor, teacher, listener, role model and friend for 23 years. God has used you well in this time and our prayer is that God will continue to bless your ministry for many years to come.

Covenant has been supporting SERRV for many years by purchasing a variety of Fair Trade items like coffees & chocolates. Thanks to everyone who purchased fair trade items at our Fall Fun-d Raising Day. We still have plenty of chocolate bars and some ornaments on hand to buy.

Education Ministries News

Do you ever wonder about what Covenant offers Adults during the 10a Education Hour? We offer 3 classes from which to choose:

The Disciples Class meets in the library at the back of the sanctuary (opposite Randy's office). Bob Kennel leads this scripture-focused class based on The International Sunday School Lessons plan of the Uniform Series; and Jack Reilly is the substitute leader. Each quarter the class members explore a variety of biblical texts & background provided in the student book, but the interpretation and application to daily life come from the lively class discussion each week. Much of the Bible is presented during a 6 yr. cycle of readings.

The Seekers Class meets in the Worship & Wonder room at the end of the hall on the left. Carole Tyler facilitates the engaging conversations that follow the Lectionary. Lectionary scriptures are chosen readings based on the Church year, beginning each Advent; and includes readings from the Psalms; Old Testament; one Gospel; and one of the Epistles (Paul's Letters); with a special focus on the reading for the morning message that Sunday. A photocopy of the week's assigned readings is provided and also the Lectionary readings appear in Covenant's Thursday email.

The Hot Topics Class meets in a corner of the sanctuary often times to discuss current events and hot-button issues of the day and how our faith speaks to them. Sometimes discussions are based on book studies read by the class. Books that have been explored in the recent past include, *God is Not One, God is Not Great* and *What's the Least I Can Believe and Still Be a Christian.* Whether it's current events or a book study, the weekly discussions are always thought-provoking & informative. Participants take turns volunteering to facilitate each week's discussion.

All members and guests are welcome to join in these biblical and theological pursuits. Classes for children, 3 yrs- 5^h grade; youth 6th-12th grade; and a nursery for infants & toddlers are also offered during the Education Hour. Please pop in and see which class is right for you!
