He recalled the gift of the Christ Child to a worn and weary world...a world without much hope. A world in need of hanging its hopes on Bethlehem...a world in which the faithful prayed, "O come to us, abide with us, our Lord, Emmanuel..."

Last Sunday in worship, as we began our Advent journey to Bethlehem, we were invited to write our hopes on a sticky-note star and hang it from the stable as a prayer for God to enter our hearts yet again in hope of:

The world in which we live continues to be in need, no, in *great* need, of hanging our hopes on Bethlehem... So...what do you hang your hopes on?

Covenant's SCRIP Update

As of the end of November, Covenant has earned over \$2800 with the SCRIP program! Thank you to everyone who continues to use the SCRIP program for their households! In the next few months there will be Christmas, holiday parties, family vacations, teacher's gifts, end-of-year customer appreciation gifts, winter clothing needs, school supplies for the new semester; December and January birthdays and anniversaries – not to mention regular grocery, medicine, gas, and other household needs –gift cards from the SCRIP program can be for some of those needs.

Not sure what SCRIP is? SCRIP is a fundraising program where you purchase SCRIP (substitute money) in the form of gift cards and gift certificates from hundreds of local, national, and online retailers. While you pay face value for the gift card, Covenant works with the Great Lakes Scrip Center to purchase the cards at a discount and Covenant keeps the difference.
