Jesus' Version of Living the Questions

As we have done so in previous years, many of us are currently engaged in the mind & soul stretching study, Living the Questions; exploring the teachings of Jesus, seeking nuggets of truth; daring to ask our own questions about who this Jesus...all so that we might catch a glimpse of Jesus pointing us toward an even deeper understanding of who God is.

It occurred to me, as I considered what life might have been like for Jesus in the wilderness, that he just might be experiencing his own version of *Living the Questions*; asking his own probing questions. Frederick Buechner helped me recognize this as he penned the following in his book, *Whistling in the Dark:* "...After being baptized by John in the Jordan River, Jesus goes off alone into the wilderness for 40 days; asking himself the question, "*What does it mean to be me...What does it mean to be Jesus?"*

Working through this one question, surely must have helped him see the bigger picture of what God was calling him to do and to be. During these weeks as we make our way to Jerusalem, you and I are also being challenged to live out this same question...in one way or another, "What does it mean to be me?"

This one question might be enough for us to ponder, but Buechner lists many other questions for us to gnaw on during this holy season: (may I suggest meditating & journaling about each one)?

- If you had to bet everything you have on whether there is a God or whether there isn't, which side would get your money and why?
- When you look at your face in the mirror, what do you see in it that you most like? What do you see in it that you most deplore?
- If you had only one last message to leave to the handful of people who are most important to you;
- what would it be, in 25 words or less?
- Of all the things you have done in your life, which is the one you would most like to undo?
- Which is the one that makes you happiest to remember?
- Is there any person in the world, or any cause... that, if circumstances called for it, you would be willing to die for?
- If tomorrow were the last day of your life, what would you do with it?

If we listen intently to our attempts to answer these questions, more than likely we can hear a faint whisper about not only who we are and who we are becoming; but also who we might be failing to become.

As we carry with us some of these thought provoking questions and a few answers we might just bear witness to what it means to wear sackcloth and ashes...the "haute couture" of Lent...signs of repentance in search of forgiveness & reconciliation. And at the end of our 6 week journey, with God as our constant, attentive partner; we will be invited to exchange our worn-out, dingy wardrobes; for the bright and dazzling garments of the new life; and life eternal of Easter morn...Thanks be to God...Blessings, Rev. Some years back, I went on a church retreat, and some of us visited an outdoor labyrinth at the St. Joseph Center in Wheeling, WV. It was my first experience with a labyrinth. Labyrinths are found all around the world. Often used as a symbol of the path of the soul through Christian life, a labyrinth has only one path that twists its way to the center and back out again. There is only one entrance and exit, there are no dead ends, and the paths never intersect. According to author Richard Rohr, there are only two decisions related to a labyrinth: the decision to enter the path, and the decision to stay on the path.

Much like walking the path into a labyrinth, Lent is the season in church life when we go deep into ourselves and reexamine our values. Sometimes the path seems long, but we know it will eventually lead us someplace wonderful: the resurrection of Easter, the hope of the future.

This month, as we journey through Lent, may our paths of introspection and self-reflection bring each of us to a new understanding of who—and whose—we are, as together we enter the path, and together we stay on the path...Darla Baldwin, Moderator
