## Announcing an October Sermon Series: "Water, Water, Everywhere?

This past summer I was blessed once again to attend a week at the Chautauqua Institute. The weekly theme was, "Water Matters." When I first learned that was the theme for week I admit I wasn't all that sure that the worship, lectures, music, etc would be all that interesting. I couldn't have been more wrong. The daily science lectures were presented by a series of National Geographic photographers, scientists and journalists...teaching us, reminding us and cautioning us about what it means to be good stewards of this important natural resource...and it was all wonderfully refreshing!

The inter-faith presenters also taught us so much about the reverence and importance of water to some of the world religions. And the daily preaching about the role water plays in our own Christian tradition was presented by one of my favorite preachers/writers, Barbara Brown Taylor. What a mind-stretching/mind-blowing week it turned out to be!

Every time I drive out of the Chautauqua gate at the close of my week, I always want to be able to share all that I learned and experienced with each of you. Realistically I know this is nearly impossible. But the few weeks after my return home, I still couldn't let it go...

So, because of the impact of "Water Matters" has had on me, I decided one way to do this was to share some of my week with you through a sermon series on Water found in two stories from the Hebrew Testament and two stories found in John's gospel...

Don't forget to check out the SCRIP poster. It has up-to-date information on what retailers are running specials, new or discontinued retailers, how much Covenant has earned, and ideas on how you can participate in the SCRIP program. With schools back in session and the holiday season approaching, many retailers are offering specials so keep checking the display board for the latest information.

Even though it is only October, it is not too early to start planning Christmas presents and how you could use SCRIP to help with those gifts. Travelling for Thanksgiving or Christmas?
