"In all things, give thanks..."

That's how the writer of I Thessalonians 5: 18 puts it. It's as if this time of year prompts these words to capture our attention as our artist-God mixes, dips and dabs the bright hues of red, gold and yellow on God's palette; while providing the dancing leaf showers against the background of a bright blue sky. Ah..."in all things, give thanks."

As we move through November and approach the Thanksgiving holiday, I always find myself pondering why we have just a season, a day, a long weekend for set aside for giving thanks; when, as people of faith, we are clearly reminded in these words of scripture, to live our entire lives giving thanks all the time and in all circumstances...

While we may not always remember to say "thanks" to God 24/7, I daresay when our eyes drink in the splendor of God's world, it's a whole lot easier say. It's as if we can't seem to help ourselves while in the presence of God's beauty. Yet consider Eugene Peterson's The Message, as he translates this same scripture:

"...Be cheerful no matter what; pray all the time; thank God no matter what happens. This is the way God wants you who belong to Christ Jesus to live..."

Did you catch that? "...No matter what...Be cheerful." "Pray all the time..." "No matter what happens...thank God..." Is this really how God calls us to live?

As with many of you, my thoughts and prayers continue to ascend on behalf of all who were in the destructive path of Hurricane Sandy and are now in the aftermath just beginning to sense the reality of what it means to try to put their lives together... And this scripture keeps coming back to me time and time again...and haunts me to the depth of my very soul...

Sure, I get the part about praying all the time...And don't you know the abundance of prayers that were and continue to be offered by those most affected and by those who care and love them the most. Yet the real challenge in living out this scripture comes with God calling us to be cheerful and thanking God no matter what...

- even in the midst of finding food and clean water or a safe place to live, even for a little while: Be cheerful-Thank God;
- as you wait patiently for the electricity to come back on; and for modes of transportation and goods & services to be available again: *Be Cheerful-Thank God;*
- as you need continuing hospital care for yourself or a loved one; or birth babies in the midst of evacuation; or grieve the death of Sandy's victims: **Be Cheerful-Thank God;**
- as you await an eventual return to school and work: Be Cheerful-Thank God...

And all we have to do is listen deeply with our hearts to hear the quiet sobbing as well as the loud laments: *"How long, O Lord, how long?"*

Many will not be able to fully recover all that has been destroyed and it will be weeks and months, even a year or two for others; before they can claim any sense of normalcy in their lives...

As I reflect on all the destruction I see from the comfort of my safe & dry living room, one thing's for certain: God doesn't bring on the challenges of life that so many are experiencing from Hurricane Sandy or any other devastating circumstances; nor does God bring about the challenges you and I have already experienced or will face in the future ...when it's our turn at bat in this world, all God asks of us is to be faithful; to trust God more; and to live as God calls us to live by being cheerful; praying always; and thanking God...no matter what... Blessings, Rev. Joanne
