After all, the seduction of all the ads & commercials calls out to me with the promises that if I would only buy all those way too expensive gifts, I would feel so much better about myself; others would surely love me more and certainly think more highly of me and my exquisite tastes-ha!. But making those January credit card payments splashes my face with the icy cold waters of reality; leaving me to realize that none of those "perfect" expensive gifts actually delivered on those promises.

So, here I am, a few days either side of Black Friday, about to immerse myself in the art of gift-giving in the midst of searching for the hope, peace, joy and love of this holy time as I explore God's promises guaranteed to last a lifetime. Then it dawned on me; Advent is not the time to focus on what I want FOR Christmas. Advent is the time to focus on what I want FROM Christmas as we're surrounded by the wonder & awe, the beauty & joy of that first Christmas when God, the best Gift-Giver ever, decided to live among us and pitch God's tent in the backyards of our restless hearts...

I'm about to embark on different kind of Advent journey.
