#### Fasting & Feasting...the Paradox of Lent

Quite early in life, thanks mostly to the Roman Catholic influence of my mother's family and some of my childhood friends, I was introduced to the idea of "giving up" something for Lent. It wasn't enough just to eat fish on Fridays, I was expected to also do without something that I absolutely loved until Easter. As years passed I wasn't always committed to this tradition; and at other times, I used Lent as an excuse for losing weight!

Early on in my ministry I was confronted with this whole idea all over again. I used it as a teaching tool with my youth groups...we researched Lent and its history and came to understand that as we prepared to move through Lent it would be more meaningful to "take on" some discipline or practice that would make us better people; to focus more on filling our lives with good things. During that same time I came across the following anonymous prayer and we made it our own. I invite you to make it yours as we make our way to Jerusalem and beyond...

Don't say you haven't been warned: This ain't gonna be easy...

Holy God, May I...

FAST from judging others; and FEAST on the Christ within them.

FAST from emphasis on differences; FEAST on celebrating our diversity.

FAST from apparent darkness; FEAST on the reality of light.

FAST from thoughts of illness; FEAST on the healing power of God.

FAST from words that condemn; FEAST on words that praise.

FAST from discontent; FEAST on gratitude.

FAST from anger; FEAST on patience.

FAST from pessimism; FEAST on optimism.

FAST from worry; FEAST on trusting God more.

FAST from complaining; FEAST on appreciation.

FAST from negatives; FEAST on affirmatives.

FAST from unrelenting pressures; FEAST on unceasing prayer.

FAST from hostility; FEAST on nonresistance.

FAST from self-concern; FEAST on compassion for others.

FAST from personal anxiety; FEAST on eternal Truth.

FAST from discouragement; FEAST on hope.

# What Does Fat Tuesday Have to Do With Me And Should I Feel Insulted?

Here's a little background to why the church family is invited to eat pancakes on February 11:

Some Christians in many countries call it Shrove (confession)Tuesday; or Carnival (Goodbye to Meat) and others Mardi Gras or Fat Tuesday...and all share the same ancient history and tradition. It's the day before Ash Wednesday, marking the beginning of the 40 days & nights of Lent( not counting Sundays, the day we celebrate Christ's Resurrection); all leading us to the wonder and joy of Easter morning.

In ancient days, faithful Christians were forbidden by the church to consume meat, butter, eggs or milk-no mention of a ban on chocolate though ③. However, if a family had a store of these foods they all would go bad by the time the fast ended on Easter Sunday. What to do? Solution: use up the milk, butter and eggs no later than the day before Ash Wednesday. And so, with the addition of a little flour, the solution quickly presented itself in pancakes...Lots of 'em! That's why many Christians celebrate the day before the serious work of Lent begins by getting together for good times and eating pancakes and other rich foods.

Because we were unable to secure reservations on the actual FAT TUESDAY and not to be outdone by our disappointment, we stepped out as trend-setters and decided to reserve the same dining areas, just doing it the day before! Hence we're gathering on Fat Tuesday EVE!

And two days later...the holy season of Lent begins with Ash Wednesday Worship, February 13, at 7:30p (childcare provided). The Taizé-style worship will be filled with sacred readings & songs, closing by receiving the ashen sign of the cross on our foreheads; reminding us of our common humble beginnings and our common end. During the weeks that follow, Jesus bids us follow; promising to be with us giving us strength and courage to grow in faith and daring us to take a closer look at how we choose to live our lives; wrestling with what we are willing to die for; but even more important, what we are willing to live for...
