Outreach Ministry News Updates...

Church World Service CWS Emergency Cleanup Buckets

Heavy precipitation from early 2013 storms and floods has resulted in widespread and severe flooding in Illinois and other states. We have an opportunity to assemble CWS Emergency Cleanup Buckets to help those in need. Outreach would like to collaborate with other ministries/groups (Youth, Sunday School classes, Amazing Grays etc.) at Covenant to assemble these buckets. We could select a day to work together or your group can work independently.

We would like to collect the buckets the third week in July so that we can deliver them to the local CWS office shortly thereafter. CWS has shipped nearly 1,500 CWS Emergency Cleanup Buckets to Illinois for flood-affected households and expects to ship thousands more.

"The CWS Emergency Cleanup Buckets are giving hope and help to survivors," said Barry Shade, CWS associate director for U.S. disaster response. "With needs assessment ongoing, CWS expects to respond to additional requests from Illinois and other states for buckets. When we do, we hope to be able to respond without delay."

As the 2,500th CWS Emergency Cleanup Bucket arrives in flood-ravaged Illinois, Church World Service is appealing urgently for people to replenish its rapidly dwindling supply. Only about 2,600 CWS Emergency Cleanup Buckets remain in the agency's warehouse in New Windsor, MD, Shade said. Cleanup-up Bucket value: **\$56**
