Where Did the Time Go?

October 1988, I began a series of interviews for the position of Organizing Pastor with a fledgling congregation that began in June 1986. The image with which I approached this ministry was that of a baby bird just about to leave the nest under the watchful eye of its mother. The Mama Bird chirping some last minute flight instructions, words of encouragement, followed by a few gentle nudges of her beak. Of course she didn't anticipate that her baby would suddenly soar like a majestic eagle; all she hoped for was a moment or two per take-off before safely returning to the ground...trying to get the hang of it, all the while gaining confidence with each attempt.

I even imagined some of the birds who had long-since graduated from flight school, taunting the baby bird and wondering why it took so long to grow into its reason for being. But every parent comes to know and understand how much time it takes to impart guidance and wisdom, allowing for times of trial and error, as one matures in order to soar and capture the winds of the Spirit...

As I reflect on our time together I sometimes find myself lingering at the corner of "Why did it take so long?" and "Where did the time go?" only to realize during these past 24 and half years there have actually been at least four congregations that have brought us along the way to becoming the dynamic community of faith we are today:

- We had the Pioneers of the Founding Era who captured God's vision for Covenant; who soon made way for their adventurous spirit as it attracted some Settlers along the way; never losing sight of that vision and excitement; followed by those who came to know the importance of a bit of brick and mortar; allowing still others to know Covenant Christian Church was here to stay in this transient yet fast-growing community of Cary and surrounding areas.
- The flight plan then called for a way to serve the growing number of children and youth among us; leading the then current congregation to add more classrooms and that long-awaited playground. And it wasn't long before God gave us a new ministry that included student ministers from Duke Divinity School to gain experience by working with our young people; which then led us to be a place of welcome for several ordained and licensed ministers among us.
- And it seemed that we were off and running...all the while paying close attention to how God was calling us into God's future...as a community of believers growing in faith, open and welcoming to all of God's children and how we can best serve the needs of others. Through the past 7-10 years we have gathered together, sustaining the commitment and dedication of members and guests that has allowed us the needed time to grow in leadership.
- And now, look around you, people of God: We continue to heed God's flight instructions; we hear God's words of encouragement and feel God's gentle and not so gentle nudges as we read God's flight pattern before us; urging

us to always be flexible and open to take off to new heights, remembering to land from time to time to regroup and prepare for yet another take-off...

We not only are standing on holy ground, the ground beneath us is pliable yet stronger than ever...we're poised and ready to soar to higher heights with the depths of faith within us. We know how to be Church... the church God continues to call us to be as we dare to capture the winds of God's Spirit...thanks for allowing me to soar to great heights with all of you...*with a heart filled with love & gratitude,*

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Covenant's SCRIP Update

Covenant's SCRIP program offers a variety of methods for purchasing SCRIP. More and more retailers continue to participate in these different options, so here is a clarification of some of these options:



ScripNow! – ScripNow! means your scrip purchase is available to you shortly after payment is received. If you choose to pay for your order online, your scrip is available within minutes – you just have to print out the cards. There are detailed directions on these print-outs explaining how to use the gift card if making a purchase online and instructing cashiers how to ring up a sale using this form of gift card. If you choose to pay for your order by giving the SCRIP volunteers a check, your order will be available for print out Sunday afternoon. Either way, you will receive an email informing you that your ScripNow! purchase is ready. The ScripNow! option also allows you to purchase E-gifts. As you order your scrip, mark that it is a gift. You will be walked through providing the recipient's information. The electronic gift card will then be delivered to your recipient's email on the date you choose.

Reload – If you have purchased a gift card from Covenant's SCRIP program and the retailer participates in Reload, you can go online and add money to that physical card. The new balance will be available on your card in 1-2 business days from the time that payment is received. Again, you will receive an email that says that your reload has been processed and your card reflects the updated balance. Please note, the program will only allow you to add balance to a card that has been purchased through Covenant's SCRIP program.

ReloadNow! – This option allows you to add money to your physical card, but the new balance is updated within minutes of payment being received. Similar to ScripNow!, if you pay online, your new balance is available within minutes, and if you choose to give a check to the SCRIP volunteers, your order will be processed Sunday afternoon. You will receive an email that states your order has been processed and your card's balance has been adjusted.

More and more retailers are participating in these new options, making it easier than ever to participate in the SCRIP program and help Covenant. For the month of July, the SCRIP poster in the hallway across from the office lists all the retailers that currently participate in these programs, so you can see how many of them you regularly use. CWS Emergency Cleanup Buckets

We are still looking for sponsors to fill the CWS Cleanup buckets. Four empty buckets have been purchased and are waiting to be filled by YOU! The Seekers Sunday School class has agreed to sponsor a bucket. We have three more needing sponsors. Look for a sample bucket in the entry-way on Sunday, June 30. You may contact a member of the Outreach Ministry; Shirley Kennedy or Renie Palmer to let one of us know of your interest.

Contents of the buckets and instructions for assembling the buckets are noted below. You may also pick up a hard copy list in the entry-way.

To assemble an Emergency Cleanup Bucket we will need:

- One five-gallon bucket with resealable lid
- Five scouring pads
- Seven sponges, assorted sizes
- One scrub brush
- Eighteen cleaning towels (reusable, like Easy Wipes®)
- One 50-78 oz. box dry laundry detergent
- One 12 oz. bottle of liquid concentrated household cleaner (like Lysol®)
- One 25 oz. bottle liquid disinfectant dish soap (like Dawn®)
- One package of 48-50 clothespins
- Clothesline, two 50 ft. or one 100 ft.
- Five dust masks
- Two pairs latex gloves (like Playtex®)
- One pair work gloves
- 28-bag roll of heavy-duty trash bags (30-45 gallon)
- One 6-9 oz. bottle of insect repellent (pump, drops or lotion, not aerosol)

Please provide all liquids in new, unopened plastic bottles. Be sure to send only new materials. Place all items in the plastic bucket, making sure they are packed securely to avoid damage during shipment, and seal lid with packing tape.
