"Lord, Teach Us to Pray..."



The theme of our General Assembly in Orlando a couple of weeks ago was, "**Lord, Teach Us to Pray...**" A great theme for a spirit-filled family reunion of the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ) in the U.S. & Canada. And spirit-filled it was in our worship with joy-filled music and challenging messages; around our tables of Communion and other meals; and Yes, spirit-filled with the power and presence of God's Spirit—the Holy Wind of God—as it blew through the convention center during our business sessions...

One of those business resolutions called us to consider the word, "ALL"—where we understood again and again, that this small three-letter word means just exactly that...**ALL**...which led us to overwhelmingly pass resolution GA 1327 that celebrates our entire denomination as a welcoming and grace-filled Church...

And I thought to myself...hmmm...how good and right it is for the whole church to follow Covenant's lead! ☺ For we are and have been just that...a welcoming and grace-filled community of faith taking our direction from God in Jesus Christ...

"We are Disciples of Christ, a movement for wholeness in a fragmented world. As part of the one body of Christ, we welcome all to the Lord's Table as God has welcomed us..." (Disciples of Christ Identity Statement) "**Lord, Teach Us to Pray...**"

"**Lord, Teach Us to Pray...**" a request directly from the mouths of Jesus' disciples who had begun to sense the importance of prayer and even having witnessed the power of prayer as they accompanied Jesus, still didn't know exactly how to pray. Perhaps like some of us, they needed to begin by asking God for the courage and strength to step outside their comfort zone when it came to having a two-way conversation with none other than God. And so Jesus offered them the prayer that the church has come to call, The Lord's Prayer; which was part of last Sunday's Gospel reading (Luke 11: 1-13) as Jesus gave us a pattern for praying.

The lesson then went on to include the parable of the Nagging Neighbor as yet another lesson about prayer: Keep on keepin' on...be persistent...never give up...be relentless & vigilant...At first glance it's easy to interpret this as a story about God who answers our prayers, especially when we nag God until God gives in. Making *US* persistent; *US* as the ones who never give up; who are relentless...right?

But...what if we could see and understand *God* as the one who keeps on keepin' on...the persistent one; the one who never gives up; the relentless God? It invites us to see God, and not ourselves, as the one who never, ever gives up on us or on being in relationship with us...Especially when it comes to God answering our prayers...yes...ALL our prayers as only God can; in God's own wisdom; in God's own time...and sometimes the answer to our prayers is a resounding, "NO!"

And in those dreadful, disappointing times when God, like a loving mother and father comes back to us with that

resounding "NO," Frederick Beuchner reminds us, "Even when God does not bring you the answer you want, *God will bring you God's very presence*. And maybe at the secret heart of all our prayers, this is what we are really praying for!" (Beuchner, *Wishful Thinking*, pg. 71).

...*God's very presence*...That's it, isn't it? And Jesus says, "Ask and it will be given you; seek and you will find; knock and the door will be opened." And it's this open door that reveals the very presence of God...

"Lord, Teach Us to Pray...as we move into your future... Blessings, Rev. Joanne"

The people of this congregation helped me to reclaim my faith and to display it in ways that helped others see the glory and grace God offers us through Jesus Christ.

As we sit in the congregation on Sunday mornings, or participate in a potluck supper, God works through us sometimes without our knowledge. We may think, and believe, we are worshiping to continue the path of our own journey of faith, but God works through us in ways we can't imagine, and our presence may be God's way of helping someone else.

May the Lord bless you and give you peace as God works miracles through you and with you.

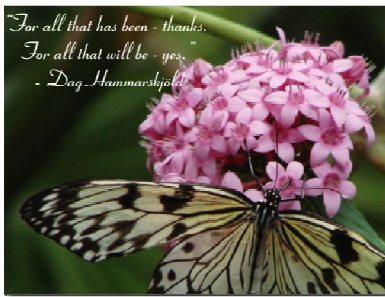
