Dear Friends.

Recently I read about a survey conducted by Think Finance which gauged responses from Americans of across varied income brackets about their holiday expenses (a link to the article follows this letter). 45% of them said that the holiday season brings so much financial pressure that they would prefer to skip it altogether. Nearly half of them said that their level of stress around the holidays was either high or extremely high. And, not at all coincidentally, 45% said they did not have money set aside to cover their holiday expenses.

We can all agree that the consumerism of Christmas is out of hand. This year, Black Friday sales began at retail stores on Thanksgiving Day, meaning store employees were asked to be at work instead of at home with their families. Of course, retail executives would not have set those hours if they weren't reasonably sure shoppers would take advantage of them, and take advantage they did. Millions lined up outside stores, presumably while their families gathered around Thanksgiving tables, to get the best deal they could on electronics or some other item. There is something seriously wrong when the day we have set aside to give thanks for all that we have is followed so closely by such a frenzied clamor for more, more, more. Some of us are better at resisting the tug of consumerism than others, but there are few whose lives are not touched by it in some way.

each other really matters. Still others of us have grown cynical and disillusioned by this exchange of stuff, rightly realizing that we have wandered far from the meaning of Christmas and lost sight of the kind of lives Christ has called us to live. But if Christmas is about the joy of knowing the depth of God's love for us, revealed in a baby (and that is what Christmas is all about, Charlie Brown), then neither harried overspending or self-righteous grousing seems like an appropriate way to celebrate. All the power anything ever has over us is the power we give it. This is the life of freedom Christ has made possible for us. One by one, Christ disarmed the powers of the world that had held the spirits of the people prisoner for too long—Caesar and the long arm of the Roman Empire, possessions, privilege, violence, discrimination, death. He defied the power of each with his life, and through his resurrection, revealed to us the truth about what has ultimate power over us . . . and what doesn't.

So the question that remains is this--why have we let our joy be so easily muddled by things that should have no power over us? 45% of people--and I'm going to guess that every single last one of them once looked forward to Christmas as children, not because of the stuff they got (OK, maybe that was part of it), but because of the awe and wonder and dreams it inspired in them--have had that joy robbed by something that need not have power over them. The people in your life that you truly love and who truly love you will not be disappointed if your gift to them this Christmas is not something that you fought someone for on Black Friday (or any other day). Who made you feel like you had to break the bank? Likely, there is no one person to point the finger at. The power of cultural persuasion has its grip on you. Tell it "no" this Christmas. Christ has made that possible, as well as your liberation and ultimate joy.

Cynicism and frustration do not exactly compliment joy, either. Even the most righteous anger is still anger, and Christ did not give his life so that we can walk around imprisoned by our frustrations with the world. He gave it so that we could offer a joyful alternative to the world's false hopes. Weary shoppers seduced by the commercialization of Christmas do not need a lecture about the reason for the season. What they need is someone so in touch with that reason that His light shines from within them. This is the joy of Christmas, the gift of the Christ Child to us. If you want to give it to someone else, it must first be truly yours. Ask God to give you more of it and less angst about the ringing cash registers.



Whatever it is, my prayer is that it will not rob you of the complete joy that God has given each of us in the Christ child. May it fill you and yours this Christmas.



Covenant's SCRIP Update

If you want to purchase physical gift cards in time for Christmas, the last day we can accept an order is Sunday, December 13. Those orders will be available to pick up Sunday, December 20. If you are ordering ScripNow products, you have until about fifteen minutes before you want to give it to order those, as long as your account is set up and you have completed the PrestoPay process. And remember, if you are giving an e-gift, you can set what date you would like that gift delivered when you purchase it, up to a year ahead of time.

Now is also a great time to start planning how you can use SCRIP to help with your household purchases in 2016. Gas, household supplies, medicines, school and office supplies, shoes and clothing may all be able to be purchased with SCRIP.
